Prior learning

Vocabulary and definitions

Word	Definition
Rules	an accepted principle or instruction that states the way things are or should be done, and tells you what you are allowed or are not allowed to do
Responsibility	something that it is your job or duty to deal with
Talents	natural aptitude or skill
Belonging	a sense of fitting in or feeling like you are an important member of a group
Frightened	feeling afraid or anxious.
Scared	feeling fearful or frightened
Nervous	feeling worried and anxious
Anxious	feeling or showing worry, nervousness, or unease about something with an uncertain outcome
Contribution	the part played by a person or thing in bringing about a result
Debate	a serious discussion of a subject in which many people take part:
Opinion	a view or judgement formed about something, not necessarily based on fact or knowledge
Role model	a person looked to by others as an example to be imitated
